This piece was originally written for orchestra and choir and you are sure to recognise it!

Concert Prelude Philip Sparke
Philip Sparke is a well know contemporary composer who has written many pieces for wind bands.

Finlandia Jean Sibelius

The Finnish composer wrote this in 1899. The melody is also used as a Hymn tune. For such a grand piece it had very lowly origins, being written for a press pension celebration.
